## LIBROS STUDY GROUP

The LIBROS Bookbinding Study Group was board-approved in 2005 to encourage those who wanted the challenge of learning new bookbinding techniques and structures beyond the time limitations of the regular meeting.

We have begun to calendar the schedule for 2011. The calendar is divided in two-month segments and members of the group choose the dates and the projects for the remainder of the group. It is expected that participants will have the basic bookbinding skills behind them and then can enjoy working with others on bookbinding and book arts activities. Study group members are asked to participate on a regular basis and to prepare and offer presentations, rotating through the schedule with all other participants in the group.

During the past year, the group studied Daniel Kelm's wire edge binding, Keith Smith's exposed spine bindings, making woodcuts and using the boards as covers as well as exchanging prints with others in the group, variations on Hedi Kyle's Secret Belgian Binding, the checkerboard binding, pop-ups, embellishing metal covers, and various methods of closures.

# Call For Artist Entries

The Placitas Artists Series is calling for artists to exhibit their works for the 2011–12 season at the Las Placitas Presbyterian Church. This will be a special season, our Silver Anniversary, celebrating 25 years of excellent music and art in Placitas!

We have nine musical concerts each year, complemented by art shows, in a beautiful, spacious gallery setting, with a reception for the artists the day of the concerts. Four artists are selected, by jury, for a show each month, September through May 2011–12. Three of the artists' work hangs on the walls of the gallery and the fourth artist will be one whose work is free standing or sits on a table (for example, sculpture, weavings, jewelry, pottery, and so on), who will show the day of the concert only. All artists receive a year's exposure on our website, and two tickets to the concert.

The application process closes **May 1, 2011**. Notification will be by July 1, 2011. Go to our website at *www.placitasarts.org*, click on Our Visual Artists, and download application form.

## Making a Bookbinding Kit

I'm excited about the upcoming LIBROS programs, and while looking at the calendar I was reminded that it might be well (particularly for our newer members) to list items for a Bookbinding Kit. Making up a Kit is something that every member will want to do over time and you will find it invaluable for hands-on programs and workshops, as well as for your general bookbinding efforts. Below is a list recommended by Mita Saldana in a previous Newsletter:

A good kit should include --

- Bonefolder
- Scissors
- ✿ Bookbinder's Sewing Needles
- Linen Thread
- PVA Glue and glue brush
- Exacto Knife (a breakaway one is more useful)
- Steel Ruler (cork-backed for non-skid purposes)
- Bookbinders's Awl
- Paper Knife/Bookbinder's Knife
- Cutting Mat
- Bees Wax
- Triangle
- Pliers
- Sand Paper/Emery Board

Members can, of course, add their own items that they find useful such as a glue stick, bulldog clips, pencils and a sharpener, etc.

If you have questions about any of these tools, just put them out to the group or ask some of the more experienced members at the meetings. Also, if anyone has other tools to suggest that have been especially helpful, please share with the group. – *Jo Bryant*
